Chairman's Report



The Union will record a surplus in 2013, thanks to the strong performance of our investment with Ausbil Dexia. However, our rugby operations recorded a loss, and although we had anticipated that in our budget for the year, it must be said that we cannot continue that year in, year out. Therefore, unfortunately, clubs should

budget for increases in registration fees.

Whilst finances are, of course, important, we must not lose sight of the Union's core purpose. It is pleasing to report that despite these tight financial times we did not reduce our level of service to clubs nor cut programs. Indeed, we invested in an update of our website, now accessible on a mobile platform, with an eye to future enhancements that will make club administration easier. Also, we are beginning the process of reinstating a Colts representative program, utilizing the new focus on Sevens Rugby as a starting point.

Our senior Representative Team took on annual foes, NSW Country and Queensland Suburban. It was pleasing that both games were played as curtain raisers to big matches, particularly the Barraclough Shield at Suncorp Stadium as part of the Reds v Lions game day. The team performed very well, going down in a close one against Country and routing Queensland in a very dominant display, ensuring coaches Damon Baffico and Kristian Berghofer ended their very successful two year stint on a high. On behalf of the Union I thank them for their time and expertise and wish them all the best in their future coaching efforts. Thanks also to team manager, Peter Holt, for his efficient and cheerful co-ordination of the squad.

Congratulations must be extended to St Patrick's Rugby Club for an outstanding season which culminated in the heart-stopping joint Kentwell Cup premiership with Balmain, and also the 1st Division Club Championship and Cowboy Cup for inter-divisional Club Champions. Congratulations also to our Club of the Year, Petersham, for earning promotion to 1st Division, and to Blue Mountains, who will move from 3rd to 2nd Division in recognition of their club championship win.

I would also like to make special mention of Sydney Irish for winning the Jeffrey Cup in their first year of regular Suburban competition. That is an amazing effort, but just as importantly they have been a wonderful addition to our Union, hitting the right mix of competitive and social rugby. Their division has welcomed them with open arms and they in turn have been welcoming and hospitable to all comers. Long may Sydney Irish be part of the Subbies family.

Two other long standing members of the Subbies family were honoured this year, and I would like to add my personal congratulations. Firstly to John Sciberras, recipient of the Peter Kelly Medal for Service to Rugby, who has devoted over 35 years to rugby at UNSW. This Union is a much better organization because of the work and dedication of people such as John Sciberras. And congratulations also to Jake Havebond for the remarkable on-field longevity he has displayed at the very top of Subbies Rugby – winning the Kentwell Medal this year, 10 years after first doing so, and still reaping man of the match honours with our Rep Team.

Thank you to my fellow Board members for their efforts throughout the year. Thanks also to our volunteers on the Judiciary (who unfortunately had an upswing in cases) and the Appeals Tribunal. Our loyal sponsors continue to help us defray costs to clubs and we are most grateful to them for their ongoing support. Finally, thank you to the Union's staff, Mark Green, Tim Richards and Matt Holding – their professional approach to rugby administration is welcomed by our clubs.

To all clubs, players and officials, enjoy the off-season and thank you once again for your support and efforts in helping keep the Union in good shape financially and administratively.

Executive Director's Report



The highlight of 2013 was undoubtedly the Union's premier match, the Kentwell Cup Grand Final between Balmain and St Patrick's. Balmain, in their first year in Division One and up against minor premiers and last year's runners-up St Patrick's, played out a once-in-a-generation grand final with the teams unable to be split after 100

minutes of rugby. So, for only the third time in the Cup's 90 year history (Royal Australian Artillery & Bondi Surf Life Savers in 1939 and Waverley & Matraville in 1991), a joint premiership was awarded. I congratulate both teams on a wonderful spectacle, and all clubs and teams that won club championships and premierships in 2013.

At the Union's Presentation night Jake Havebond, Drummoyne's five eighth and a ten year veteran of the Suburban Representative team, won the Kentwell Medal - ten years after first winning it in 2003. Jake has also previously won the Barraclough Medal (1999 & 2000) and Clark Medal (2007) during his stellar rugby career. Jake is one of the great Suburban players of his generation, with his record of team premierships and individual awards and representative honours a wonderful testament to that. Petersham's Steve Nicholls won Coach of the Year after guiding Petersham from Division Three to Division Two Club Champions and now a place in Division One in 2014. Petersham RFC was also awarded the overall Club of the Year for their on and off-field performance. University of NSW's stalwart, John Sciberras, won the Peter Kelly Medal for Service to Rugby following his 36 years at UNSW as a player, coach and administrator.

Whilst a profit of \$50K was reported in our audited accounts this must be tempered by the fact that \$82K in income was achieved via the appreciation of the Union's investment in an Australian equity fund which saw the fund increase 25% year on year. Removing this "paper profit" from the accounts shows an operating deficit of some \$32K. This was slightly higher than anticipated largely due to poor final series attendance, which was surprising given the fine weather experienced across all finals days. Unfortunately, coinciding with the Union's grant from NSW Rugby being abolished several years ago, our operating losses over this time have now reached almost \$90K. Whilst the Union's reserves have been able to cover this shortfall it is inevitable that it will cost more to participate in rugby over the coming years.

Whilst the Union welcomed one new club, The International College of Management Sydney, our player numbers were down slightly this year and this resulted in

eight fewer teams fielded. We were also unable to field an Under 85KG competition for the first time since 2006. 2013 saw the demise of a number of clubs – Seaforth, Killara-West Pymble and Notre Dame all folded in the off-season. Too often the responsibility of running Suburban clubs falls to one person and with no succession planning the club simply disappears. This, coupled with a very strong Meldrum Cup competition, makes it hard for new clubs and struggling small clubs to continue to operate. The Union is looking at some changes at this level to alleviate the problem.

I wish to acknowledge the Union's Competition Manager, Tim Richards, who brought up a milestone of his own this year with 10 years' service to the Union. Tim, together with Matt Holding, ran the competition efficiently and professionally. Our Sydney Premiership Competition Manager, Lisa Kane, left us in July on maternity leave and we hope to welcome her back in February. In Lisa's absence Luke Thiessen from the ARU was seconded to fill the role of Premiership Competition Manager and we appreciate his efforts in the lead up to and during the finals series. We were disappointed to lose Taleah Neowhouse, our Sydney Junior Competition Manager, in July. However, we were fortunate to secure the services of long time Junior Rugby volunteer and Eastern Suburbs Rugby General Manager, Kerry Brady, who has been a great acquisition to the Union. Kerry recently won the prestigious Nick Farr Jones Spirit of Rugby Award from the Australian Rugby Union for her tireless efforts across the game, particularly at Junior level. Kerry was capably assisted by Matt Kellahan and kept the SJRU competition operating seamlessly through this transition period. The Union's intern Sam Macpherson worked across a range of competitions during his time with us and we wish him well.

At the last AGM, Alan Jones became Suburban Rugby's eighth current life member - a thoroughly deserved honour for his service to the Newport Rugby Club and years of dedication to Suburban Rugby as a Board member and representative team manager. Also at the last AGM, Geoff Granger and Peter Whittington did not seek re-election to the Board as the Division One and Two representatives, respectively. They were replaced by Jack Shute from Knox and Thomas Tudehope from Redfield Old Boys. I thank all Board members for their commitment to Suburban Rugby at Board and Sub-Committee level, over and above their own club commitments. The Union is fortunate to have our Chairman, Paul Timmins, on both the NSW Rugby and Waratahs Boards.

With over half of the Union's website traffic using a mobile device, a new Suburban website was launched in the later stages of the season. This new site was complemented by a mobile friendly site allowing easy access to all the latest results, tables and news in a concise format. On the social media front, Marty Thomas produced 15 episodes of Subbies TV (via YouTube), the Union's light hearted weekly wrap of all things rugby; 'Holdings Bits', was published online on 25 occasions, whilst our Twitter and Facebook following continued to rise, with both accounts now prominently linked to our website. In addition, material such as 'The Rugby Bored', a four part series on YouTube by Redfield boys Alex Abrams and Julien Perrottet, adds to the suite of Suburban related social media material.

Thanks to our long-term and committed sponsors, including: Coca-Cola (19 years), Interfuse, Australian Rugby Review, Gilbert (all 17 years), Leuko/Elastoplast (15 years), Icons of Sport (9 years), Beyond Sport/ISC (8 years) and BodyScience. This year we welcomed Western Union as a new sponsor of both the Union's website and representative team, and we look forward to a long association with them.

The Union thanks NSW Rugby for providing refereeing services to all Suburban matches. To the referees that officiate each week we thank you for your invaluable contribution to the game. To the Judiciary, led by Mark Groom, who marks 15 seasons on the panel and has been deservedly nominated for life membership at tonight's Annual General Meeting, thanks for your service to the Union.

Representative Team Report



The 2013 NSW Suburban Representative Team again played our two annual foes - NSW Country for the Maher-Ross Cup and Queensland Suburban for the Barraclough Shield. This year's team was tasked with retaining both trophies, after an undefeated 2012 representative program. Led by the returning management team of Coach Damon Baffico, Assistant Coach Kristian Berghofer and Manager Peter Holt, the squad was assembled, trialed, whittled down, finalized and well into training by mid April, in readiness for the Country clash at ANZ Stadium on 18 May.

The Cockatoos, as always, were strong and well drilled, and constantly looked to get on the attack. A tight first half saw the sides go into the break at 10 all. Country had taken the early lead with a try from an attacking lineout at the 20 minute mark, but positive rugby from Subbies - opting to forgo an easy shot at penalty - saw Perofeta Silva (St Pats) cross the line after some good lead-up work from the forwards, particularly the strong charging Adam Choice (Campbelltown).

Early in the second half, the Cockatoos gained the upper hand with two quick, opportunistic tries putting them in the lead, 20-13. From there, desperate defence from both sides cruelled two certain tries to keep the score close, with only a penalty added by Country in the middle part of the second period. The Subbies side displayed tremendous fighting spirit to come back from a 10 point deficit to almost snatch the match.

Loma Kaveinga (Balmain) entered the game and immediately took a lineout to help Subbies set up a driving maul deep into Country territory. After a couple of pick and drives Seva Rokobaro (Drummoyne) crashed over, with the conversion by Captain Dan Kelly (Colleagues) getting Subbies back to within 3 points.

A breakdown penalty with 5 minutes to go allowed Country to extend their lead to six points, but then

some enterprising attack down the blindside by John Fonokalafi (Balmain) and a centre-field kick by Ben Borg (Brothers) that was knocked on by the Cockatoos gave Subbies a scrum ten metres out, with minutes to play. Subbies attacked the line hoping to snatch a late victory - both Silva and Kaveinga got within metres - but after seven phases the Cockatoo's scrambling defence held on, forcing a turnover and ending Subbies' chances.

Disappointed, but unbowed, the squad regrouped to take on Queensland Suburban at Suncorp Stadium in the Reds v British & Irish Lions curtain raiser on June 8.

Suncorp is a great place to watch rugby and it looked even better as Vinny Byrne (Brothers) crossed the line early to give NSW a great start and set the scene for a very one-sided match. And on it went - a great try to Perofeta Silva (St Pats) was quickly followed by another to the Knox colt bolter, Richard Woolf. There was just enough time for Ben Borg (Brothers) to run away with a 75m solo try before the half time whistle saw us leading 26-0.

The second half started where we left off - scoring more sensational tries. Larry Hermens (St Pats) finished off some great work by Byrne, before another 75m sprint saw Simon Meiklejohn (Mosman) take the score to 38-0. Borg wrapped up the scintillating display with an intercept try that capped a wonderful evening for NSW.

Thank you to all those players who nominated, trialed and trained with the rep squad. Thank you to coaches Damon Baffico and Kristian Berghofer for giving their time and expertise. Our gratitude goes to Jerry Murphy, our physio, and trainer Craig Redgrave. Thanks also to manager Peter Holt for his hard work.

Finally, congratulations to all the rep players, and the clubs they represented so well.
